FIRST PLACE

Victor Ceja is a junior at McNary High School in Keizer, Oregon, where he plays with the wind ensemble, symphony, and the marching band. He is principal flute with Salem Youth Symphony and was selected for the 2022 OMEA All-State Orchestra; he was previously principal flute of the OMEA All-State Wind Symphony and was named alternate in the 2021 MTNA state woodwind soloist competition. Victor is a member of the GPFS and studies with Sandy Duffy Norman. He continues to seek challenges and opportunities to play and hopes to continue flute beyond high school.



SECOND PLACE

Diego Fernandez is a young flutist in Salem, Oregon currently attending South Salem High School as a Junior. Starting flute in the 6th grade, his first teacher was his band director at Stephens Middle school in 2016 and later the director at Leslie Middle School in 2017. In 8th grade, he began to study with Dr. Abigail Sperling from Linfield College in 2018. Diego won 2nd place in the 2018 Greater Portland Flute Society, 1st chair in the 2018 Salem/Keizer's All-City Honor Band, District Winner in the 2021 Solo and Ensemble festival,

was a featured soloist with the Central Oregon Symphony, and won 2nd place in the GPFS Young Artist Competition 2022. Diego is also a 2022 Young Artist Ambassador at All Classical Portland. In 2021, he began to study with Martha Long from the Oregon Symphony as he prepares for college auditions in the Fall of 2022. Currently he serves as the 2nd flute and piccolo of the Portland Youth Philharmonic Orchestra, and principal flute in both the South Salem Wind Ensemble and South Salem Symphony. He gives regular performances at senior homes and retirement centers whenever he can. Along with the flute, Diego also enjoys reading about wolves and working part time at TJ-Maxx.
