An unprecedented virtual, ninety-one member flute orchestra, The Prayer Project is an outstanding example of the global community of flutists collaboratively reflecting through music. This composition and the performance are a gift. The opening melody alone is shaped for holding close to the heart and for playing to welcome in and close each day. It shows us that, not only despite of all our present challenges but because of them, we have great and deep capacity for connecting and experiencing the healing power of music.

A composition that reflects love and hope for and faith in humanity and healing, Prayer was originally composed for flute and piano by Amanda Harberg in 2011. The piece was originally composed as a meditation on healing after an illness of a close family member.

This 2020 version of Prayer was created by Amanda Harberg in collaboration with the National Flute Association and aptly named The Prayer Project. The goal of the project was to uplift and bring friends and colleagues together through the creation and performance of music during the difficult period of isolation caused by Covid-19. The Prayer Project is conducted by Maestra JoAnn Falletta, and features 91 flutists from around the world, alongside harp, percussion, and timpani.

What we have created with The Prayer Project can offer comfort as we face some profoundly upsetting challenges. May the music we've made add some degree of meaning and sense to the frightening struggles that our world is facing. May all of our musical projects help to give courage and light to the world around us. — Amanda Harberg
